#### Accolades to Accounting


I wanted to take a moment to spotlight a department that receives little recognition but inter-

acts with and affects every employee and department at CHN - Accounting. The accounting department includes various functions: payroll, accounts payable, cash reconciliation, fixed assets, general ledger maintenance, budgeting & audit. Payroll diligently works to ensure that every employee receives their paycheck every other week. They have never missed a deadline, even if they have to work well into the wee hours of the morning or on holidays. Payroll also tracks and transmits payroll taxes, withholdings such as health and life insurance, HSA's and they ensure that you receive accurate W-2's at year end. Currently, payroll is in the process of implementing an automated time and attendance system with the assistance of Human Resources.

Accounting also includes accounts payable which tracks and pays every invoice that CHN receives and ensures that all invoices are coded properly and organized and filed efficiently. All cash received and paid is reconciled monthly and accounted for "to the penny", and all of the assets of CHN are tracked and accounted for. The accountants in accounting make sure that all revenues and expenses are properly recorded according to Generally Accepted Accounting Principals (GAAP) and assist with budgeting. Accounting reports statistics, provides report information, and produces financial reports for the Board of Directors. In addition, the entire accounting department pitches in and assists with the year end audit. In the past few years, CHN has had no audit entries or adjustments, which is quite an achievement. A thank you goes out to this department, working diligently behind the scenes.
